When you complete this course, you will also have an understanding of the evaluation process including written examinations, practical examinations, self-evaluations, and analysis and interpretation of exam results and statistics.

You will be evaluated on their practical instruction skills and their accuracy of self-evaluation. A written examination covers all theoretical material from Fire Service Instructor Level I Parts 1 & 2 and Instructional Methodology III.
